

**FLORIDA DEPARTMENT OF LAW ENFORCEMENT
INVESTIGATIVE REPORT**

On Monday, April 9, 2012, Special Agent Supervisor (SAS) David M. Lee of the Florida Department of Law Enforcement (FDLE) contacted Supervisory Special Agent (SSA) Gregory Tarbert, of the Federal Bureau of Investigations (FBI). SSA Tarbert was contacted in reference to the February 26, 2012, shooting death of Trayvon Martin.

SAS Lee requested a copy of the Report of Examination, Dated April 2, 2012, authored by Kenneth W. Marr and Hirotaka Nakasone, FBI Operational Technology Division, Forensic Audio, Video and Image Analysis Unit (FAVIAU). The FAVIAU had been specifically requested an analysis of the word following "fucking" at approximately 2 minutes and 20 seconds into the initial call George Zimmerman made to Sanford Police Department. In addition, the FAVIAU was requested to conduct a voice comparison examination of the background screams for help on a 911 recorded call to known samples of Zimmerman.

The report states: The specific request to identify the word following "fucking" at approximately 2 minutes and 20 seconds of the file could not be done due to weak signal level and poor recording quality."

The report also states: "Voice comparison is not possible for the designated voices due to extreme stress and unsuitable audio quality."

The FBI report will be maintained as a related item to this report.
